The Washington School for the Deaf, part of the Washington State Center for Childhood Deafness and Hearing Loss, is recruiting a Cook 1 to join the a dynamic, fast-paced nutrition service department! The school is scheduled to open a brand new kitchen facility next month. Apply today if you have at least one year of full-time professional cooking experience. School cooking experience and American Sign Language (ASL) skills a plus.

This recruitment closes September 25, 2009.

SALARY: Range 30 (\$2,113– \$2,724 per month) + state employee benefits package.

SCHEDULE: Day shift, school-year position in the Washington Federation of State Employees (WFSE) union.

PRIMARY DUTIES:

This position prepares meals for students and staff on a daily basis as required by menu or as directed by the Nutrition Services Manager. The nutrition services department consists of a large dining area that serves up to 200 students and staff, freezer and two walk-ins containing produce, milk, eggs, juices, etc., storage rooms containing dry goods, a break room and large kitchen. The working environment is fast paced and routine.

General duties include preparing and cooking food as required by the menu. The Cook is responsible for baking desserts and breads and preparing foods for special events. This position requires the ability to use the deep fryer, grill, steam kettle, steamers, and ovens and ranges. The Cook also cleans kitchen and dining areas, ovens, deep fryer, grill, meat slicer, stove and tray under burners; clean slicers, mixers, sinks and stoves; and washes pots and pans by hand. The Cook washes dishes with dishwasher and puts away dishes as needed.

GENERAL QUALIFICATIONS AND COMPETENCIES:

At least one year of full-time professional cooking experience and extensive knowledge and/or training in culinary arts.

High school diploma or GED.

Valid Food Worker's Permit.

Ability to pass a physical examination and FBI criminal background check.

Willing and able to work standing for the entire assigned shift.

Ability to lift and carry 15-30 lbs. on a regular basis and up to 50 lbs. occasionally.

Willing and able to follow written and/or oral instructions including detailed recipes and work effectively with others.

Ability to perform basic computer functions.
