Position Responsibilities:

The Math Teacher is responsible for implementing the curriculum for the math program at WSD for students grades 6-12; writing appropriate lesson plans; and effectively communicating with the Principal, education staff, support personnel, and parents using American Sign Language (ASL) and written English.

General Qualifications:

A master's degree in Deaf Education or Mathematics.

Ability to meet highly qualified teacher standards for **Mathematics** in one or more of the following ways: a degree or college major, college coursework (45 quarter credits or 30 semester credits), certificate endorsement, National Board Certification, or by passing the West-E test.

Knowledge of best practices related to educating students who are deaf and hard-of-hearing, including developing and implementing Individualized Educational Programs (IEPs) and behavior improvement plans.

Ability to obtain Washington State residency certification with the deaf education endorsement; planned enrollment into the Teacher Professional Certification program; and ability to pass the West-E endorsement level test in Mathematics.

Ability to communicate fluently in ASL and written English.
