Position Responsibilities:

Responsible for providing American Sign Language (ASL) instruction using ASL - English bilingual strategies to students at the Washington School for the Deaf (WSD) campus.

Duties Include:

- Teach ASL Language Arts to deaf and hard of hearing students using a bilingual instructional approach.
- Create lesson plans and implement curriculum.
- Implement Individual Education Program (IEP), behavioral intervention plans, safety plans and educational programs in collaboration with school personnel to support positive learning environments for students in the classroom.
- Maintain data on student progress in meeting IEP goals and learning objectives.
- Consistently use effective behavioral intervention techniques and document behavioral data in accordance with school policies and procedures.
- Provide ongoing effective and professional communication with parents/guardians and school staff.
- Comply with all state and federal laws and school policies and procedures. Maintain student confidentiality.
- Other responsibilities and duties assigned by the Principal.

Compensation:

Salary is based upon education and experience. Certificated staff receive 12-month pro-rated salary and are designated as overtime-exempt employees. This position is represented by the Washington Public Employees Association (WPEA).

Salary range: \$41,000 - \$65,000 per year based on 180 days. Newly hired teachers are considered non-permanent for the first two years of employment. Permanent status may be obtained after passing a 12-month probationary period.

Required Qualifications:

- Valid Washington State certification to teach.
- Master's degree in ASL Linguistics or Deaf Education.
- Ability to teach ASL to deaf and hard of hearing students.
- Ability to communicate fluently with students, school staff, parents, and school district personnel using American Sign Language (ASL) and written English.
- Knowledge of the unique educational needs of deaf and hard of hearing students including knowledge of ASL, Deaf culture and community.
- An understanding and training in use of bilingual ASL-English strategies in the classroom preferred.
- Ability to use a variety of technology effectively.
- Knowledge of principles and methods of developing and implementing curriculum, IEPs and behavioral plans.
- Ability to use professional judgment and willingness to participate in staff development and training activities.
