Position Responsibilities:

The Student Life Counselor (SLC) position creates and maintains a safe and secure environment for students attending the Washington School for the Deaf (WSD). In the residential settings, SLCs provide instruction and guidance to students who are deaf and hard of hearing for the purpose of facilitating student self-sufficiency. SLCs report to the Student Life Dean and work as part of the residential team to design, implement, assess and modify student development programs.

Duties Include:

- Supervise and care for students in the residential program.
- Assess student behavior and attend meetings as needed to recommend programming, intervention, and discipline.
- Communicate with students, supervisors, parents, SLCs, school staff, and community members using American Sign and written English.
- Maintain required communication logs and documentation of student behavior and independent livings skills data.
- Transport and supervise students to off-campus events and appointments as needed.
- Ensure the cottage living areas are kept clean, neat and safe. Graveyard staff are assigned daily cleaning duties.
- Order food and supplies for the residential cottage.
- Assist students in getting ready for school each morning.
