The School Psychologist on the Statewide Outreach Team will provide a variety of professional services to deaf and hard of hearing students at a variety of locations throughout the State of Washington.

- Assess, evaluate, observe and gather data on students' academic skills, learning aptitudes, visual-motor skills, social-emotional development, cognitive abilities, social skills and adaptive behaviors.
- Perform a wide range of screening and diagnostic tests specific to the areas of school psychology and child development.
- May participate in IEP meetings.
- Design and implement therapeutic strategies to support student developmental and educational needs.
- Write comprehensive reports, psycho-educational evaluations and behavioral intervention plans and reports.
- Collaborate with WSD School Psychologist and outreach team members and consult with teachers, school staff, and parents to ensure positive and appropriate student learning experiences.
- Maintain records and progress notes detailing assessment results and support strategies recommended.
- Travel to educational locations as assigned.
