- Serve as an appropriate role model for students.
- Communicate with students, staff, parents and others using American Sign Language.
- Monitor student activity and ensure student safety.
- Collaborate with school administrators, teachers, school personnel, and parents to ensure a safe and positive learning environment for all students.
- Report concerns and/or issues to the Principal immediately.
- Use effective special education instruction materials and techniques to teach.
- Maintain certification as required.
- Other responsibilities as assigned by the teacher/Principal.

- Washington State Certification.
- Fluency in American Sign Language and in written English (preferable; not required).
