Minutes – February 8, 2013, meeting

Reports

Finance Report (Larry Swift, Board member)

Thanks to Jessica and her staff for keeping an eye on budget information. The transition from SACS (Small Agency Client Services) is still scheduled for July 1st.

The Board would like a clearer understanding of how outreach activities are funded, especially how activities on-campus and throughout the state affect each other.

In order to fund much needed programs on and off campus, a request for supplemental monies will be submitted next year to the legislature.

The fund created with the passage of SHB 2757 allowing CDHL to set up a separate account for contracts, out-of-state tuition, donations, and other incomes, is now referred to as "19H funds." Plans for this fund will be discussed at the June Board meeting.

Rick Huan, Director

The Director highlighted his travels during the month of February:

- Presentation at Hands & Voices Conference, held in Denver, Colorado. The topic of this conference was "Conflict and Collaboration in Deaf Education." There is a nationwide effort to ensure deaf and hard of hearing children receive the best education possible and access to services nationwide. The group was excited to hear what is being done in Washington.
- Presentation at Seattle Children's Hospital on the Child First campaign and how to provide for the needs of children throughout the state.
- Meeting with Kelly Wicker, Governor Inslee's Executive Director of Internal Relations.
- Attended both Special Education Directors meetings at ESD 123/Pasco and ESD 101/Spokane.

- Met with Oberkotter Foundation’s Director of Family Engagement, along with several members of the Statewide Outreach Team, and staff from Listen & Talk. The Foundation Director was in Washington to gather information on how our collaborative partnerships work and what successes/challenges we have had.

Jane Mulholland, Superintendent

- Artist in Residence project: This May we will have Guy Wonder (WSD Class 1966) as an Artist in Residence to work with students to create art for the newly renovated auditorium lobby. Guy’s first visit will be during the week of March 5th meet with the planning team, visit classes, chat with student, and work with us to design this project. The planning committee includes Jane Mulholland, Billy Miles, Lyra Behnke, Cathy Bennett, April McArthur, Carey Price, and Curtis Peart (WSDAA Historian.)
- Interviewing four candidates via video phone on March 4th for the secondary Principal’s position. The second round of interviews will be on March 18th and a “meet and greet” will be held in McGill Library that evening. The new principal will start August 1st.

Jessica Sydnor, Business/Human Resources

- Recruiting for a Teacher Assistant to fill a vacancy.
- Filling Student Life Counselor positions due to an increased number of students.
- Due to the extra workload with the transition from SACS (Small Agency Client Services) an additional fiscal analyst will be hired.
- Working on allotments for next year. Will be meeting with departments to see what is needed.

Kris Ching, Outreach Director (Birth – 5)

- Presenting to the Family Resource Coordinators in Spokane with Amy Hardie, Teacher of the Deaf from Hope School. Amy is also a member of our Statewide Outreach Team.
- New Statewide Outreach Team members are Jennifer Olson, Audiologist from Spokane and Judy Cushman, School Counselor from Pasco.
- Kris Ching and Kerianne Christie (Early Intervention Specialist) are working closely together with several agencies throughout Washington to create systems to assist families with children birth-5 who have been diagnosed as deaf or hard of hearing.
- Working with Kerianne Christie on an EHDI (Early Hearing Detection and Intervention) Developmental Outcomes Study grant. The purpose of this grant is to collect and analyze developmental outcomes (including expressive and receptive language) for infants and children who are deaf or hard of hearing enrolled in early intervention services from multiple jurisdictions. The budget award for this grant is \$200,000 a year for three years.

Executive Session

Flying Hands Poetry Competition: Once again, huge kudos to Piper Gallucci for her leadership, along with Lyra Behnke and Lisa Malone, in planning and running this wonderful competition, which took place March 7. Sixty-three participants from 5 Washington schools participated in the daylong event. Pre-school through grade 5 performed from 9:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m., and secondary students performed from 12:30 p.m. to approximately 2:15 p.m. The poetry competition follows the national standard of the Marie Jean Philip Competition with one difference. Flying Hands also includes a Fight Song category. Feedback from the audience was positive. Long time audience members stated the quality of poetry has improved over the years with more variety and more complex poems. Many parents attended and over 200 students from High School and college ASL and interpreting programs were in the audience.

Middle School Math Competition: Four middle school students—Brandy, Cheyenna, Cristian, and Jadzia--competed in a national math competition sponsored by the National Technical Institute for the Deaf (NTID). Events started on Friday night with the

team round. Students had a set of questions and one hour to complete them. WSD's mathletes worked hard for that full hour, discussing and not giving up. They only got one question right, but it was a question that stumped several other schools so we were proud of them. Saturday was the individual rounds and our students tried their best. It was a hard competition but the kids had fun and came away realizing they have so much more to learn. Now they are back with that experience under their belts and are already beginning to prepare for next year.

Read 500: The annual school wide project to read 500 books kicked off April 12th. Students are challenged to read 10 books between now and the end of May. Any parent, Board member or staff that would like to take the challenge is welcome to participate!

Special Award: Our very own Bill Newell was honored at the CEASD annual conference in Tucson, AZ, on April 13th. He was the recipient of the Edward Allen Fay Award. This award is given to a person for a significant publication(s) related to deafness. Bill met and exceeded these criteria by authoring or co-authoring 23 books, book chapters, pamphlets, and invited papers; by publishing 20 journal articles; by being involved in 17 conference proceedings; and, by participating in the development of 4 working papers. WSD is proud to call Bill "our own."

- Tacoma D/HH program has set up a Language Planning Committee. Joan Forshay is the Coordinator. April McArthur providing support.
- Language coach support for Lake Stevens continues to provide very positive results. IEP team met last week and staff members and family report explosive growth in language. Receptive skills are improving through the use of ASL and in turn, student has improved expressive use of spoken English.

April Lynch, Human Resources Manager

Recruiting Update

- Joseph Hing has rejoined the business office team as of April 1, 2013 and is busy preparing for transition of business services back to the agency. Three on-call Teaching Assistants and one Teacher have been added to the academic substitute list.
- Current recruitments include Science/Math Teacher and Community Based Functional Instruction (CBFI) Teacher. Non-permanent Student Life Counselors have been assigned full-time shifts for the remainder of the school year. Ongoing staffing needs will be reviewed prior to the start of the 2013/2014 school year.

Jessica Sydnor, Business Services Manager

Business Office Transition:

- Effective April 1, 2013, all payables processing has returned to the agency level. We have successfully processed our first batch of payables and decreased the turn-around time by almost 80%. The Business Office will adhere to the State Administrative and Accounting Manual (SAAM) for processing timeline expectations but we feel confident that the overall payables process will prove to be more pleasant and expedient for our customers and various stakeholders.
- Effective April 15, 2013, we will be processing payroll from our local level. The original transition plan for payroll was to commence with processing effective May 1, 2013 but Small Agency Client Services has approached our agency with a request to return the process earlier. This was due to turn-over at their agency and complications associated with work load equity. After some discussion, the Business Office team has determined that we are able to take back payroll effectively immediately. We anticipate a smooth and accurate payroll run.
- The required changes to system access and signatory authority are currently underway. We have established system access for the processes that we already taken back and we anticipate to have full access and authority at the agency level by the end of May.

New/Returning Employee:

- We are please to welcome Joseph Hing back to our Business Office. Joseph (formerly Sokphy Hing) accepted Fiscal Analyst position effective April 1, 2013 and has already accomplished some cross-training with Small Agency Client Services. We are very excited to have Joseph on our team.

End of Year Processes:

- As the end of the biennium is quickly approaching, we will be limiting expenditures in preparation for budget close. We are suspending all travel requests that have not been previously approved effective April 1, 2013. Allotment proposals will be provided to the Director during the month of May. OFM projects that allotment instructions will be published in mid to late May.
