- Correction to the Superintendent's report in the Board packet:
 - Post High School Program (PHSP): Dan Crady's meeting with the Evergreen School district was cancelled due to weather. It will be rescheduled at a later date. Dan is meeting with groups around the state discussing the PHSP.
- Student presentations:
 - Board appreciation: January was School Board Appreciation month. Students produced a great video and presented the Board with a banner in appreciation of their support and dedication to the students at WSD as well as deaf/hard of hearing students throughout the state. Students involved in the presentation were: Hattie Reich, Juan Aust, Maria Presidio, and Melissa Bascom. Also, thanks to Teresa Stotler-Martin, Teacher of the Deaf, for coordinating this wonderful presentation. The Board members were very touched by both the video and banner.

- NaNoWriMo – November is National Novel Writing Month (NaNoWriMo). This is the ninth year that WSD students have participated in this program. WSD's school wide word count for 2011 was 204,148. Students shared their work and awards they received. Congratulations to all who participated in this fantastic program!
- WSBC/WSCC – The Western States Basket Classic/Western States Cheerleading Classic (WSBC/WSCC) took place this year at the California School for the Deaf in Fremont.

- Introduction of Tyler DeShaw, new ASL/Language Arts teacher in the secondary program.

Board Finance Committee Meeting

CDHL is operating successfully and is right on track financially at the present time. The Director met with staff at the Department of Enterprise Services regarding dissatisfaction with the work done by SACS (Small Agency Client Services) as well as increased costs. An easier to read financial report will be available to the Board members soon.

Project information:

- Well replacement: new wells have been dug and there is ample water now. In order to complete this project it will cost approximately \$30,000 more than anticipated.
- Auditorium: Funds for the auditorium were not re-appropriated for the 2011-2013 biennium. A request has been submitted to have the funds released so the auditorium program can be completed.

The Board would like meet in the summer to discuss a strategic plan and statewide goals for the future. An additional topic would be to discuss ways to promote the positive things CDHL/WSD is doing and invite other states to visit.

Updates:

- Legislative
 - We are in special session until April 10th.
 - SB 6568/HB 2757 passed and was signed by the Governor on March 29th. This provides an account to deposit fees for service and charges for contracts that can be carried over from year to year. This allows greater flexibility for fees and contract receipts. This becomes law on June 7, 2012
- Auditorium/Ground Source Heat Pump work
 - The Auditorium project is currently in the budget, although at a slightly reduced amount. We are waiting for final approval of the budget before we begin the work.
 - The Ground Source Heat Pump should be completed shortly. Funds are available through the biennium, however, our goal is to have this work completed expeditiously.
- Seattle Public Schools
 - Work continues with Seattle Public Schools to review current program and support for students who are deaf/hard of hearing. There is much work yet to be completed. This is an on-going endeavor and will continue for a minimum of 2 years.
- Tacoma Public Schools
 - Tacoma has articulated services available and continues to be a very strong partner. Currently, we have worked together to establish a Listening and Spoken Language Pre-school and have strengthened the ASL strand of support for students in TPS and throughout the south sound region. Additionally, itinerant support has been established to provide services for students needing a wide range of support in a variety of settings outside of the magnet program. We are working with other districts in the area to have access to supports established in this project.

Informational

- Special Ed. Director's meetings
 - ESD 123/Pasco (February & March)
 - Special ed. directors are enthusiastic to partner together and with CDHL to broaden and strengthen services in this region. Support for students needing school-to-work transition support is also on-going.
 - ESD 189/Anacortes (March)
 - I met with ESD staff to discuss the importance of maintaining the D/HH program in Anacortes and providing a more robust outreach to parents and students throughout the region. We will be partnering with ESD 189 to provide Family Academic Night events and ASL classes for families.

- Meeting with Doug Gill and John Bresko (OSPI – Office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction)
 - In an effort to streamline service options for districts, students and Families we are establishing a SINGLE POINT OF CONTACT to access services beginning in the fall. All technical assistance and direct support services will be arranged and scheduled through a single point of contact. This dates back to the hard work and direction the Board and the Legislature has been supporting in recent years.
 - John Bresko will be joining the Statewide Outreach Team so we have a consistent voice from OSPI and CDHL for services offered.
 - We are creating a standardized fee structure for services offered and will have application for services that will be consistent across all state funded services for deaf/hard of hearing children.
 - We are working jointly to create “one voice” for d/hh services offered through CDHL and WSDS (a special needs project through OSPI) – more to come later on the progress of this long established partnership.
- Attended 2012 WASA (Washington Association of School Administrators) Small Schools Conference in Yakima (March 5-6)
 - This provided an opportunity for professional development.
- Meeting with Enterprise Risk Management
 - April Lynch and Rick Hauan met with Drew Zavatsky and J. Scott Blonien from ERM, which now is part of Department of Enterprise Services (DES). They visited the top 30 agencies who have had claims in the past 10 years. We outlined what changes we have implemented and our business practices. They were so pleased by what they saw, we were asked to present business strategies that would help other agencies to the quarterly ERM meeting on March 30th.
- Audiologist meeting – Seattle Public Schools (March 8)
 - This was a positive meeting where we discussed the demographic information on deaf/hard of hearing students in Seattle Public Schools. There are 450 d/hh students receiving some level of educational support district wide.

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Video Journalism Class: Tyler De Shaw’s video journalism class has been busy this semester, learning all about news broadcast terminology such as “anchor” and “two-shot,” determining whether a news segment is newsworthy or not, and creating WSD News, a monthly student-generated news broadcast. The idea of WSD News has been inspired in part by the student news created by other schools for the deaf, particularly Oregon, Fremont, and Riverside. Read 500: 500 Books is here again! The goal of the project is to celebrate books and reading. Every year since 2001, WSD elementary and middle school students have participated in the 500 Books project, where we encourage students to read a certain number of books to reach a collective total of 500. The theme this year is “Reading’s an Adventure: Aim for the Moon!” This has traditionally been an elementary and middle school activity, and we are excited to have high school classes participating for the first time! Participating students will start counting their books read April 9 through May 25th. If the goal is met, the students will go on a surprise field trip at the end of May. The kick-off celebration is Tuesday, April 10. The emcees are the lovely Library Libby and a brand new addition to the WSD family, Library Larry.

Mother, Father Deaf Day: The WSD Alumni Association, the Southwest Center for Deaf and Hard of Hearing (SWCDHH) and WSD staff have set up a committee to plan activities for a Mother, Father Deaf Day on Sunday, April 29th. It will be held on the WSD campus from 2 to 5 pm. Both CODAs (Children of Deaf Adults) and KODAs (Kids of Deaf Adults—typically referring to children under 18) will have fun together as they appreciate Deaf culture & language, enjoy being part of the Deaf Community, honor their Deaf parents for who they are; and be proud of being CODA/KODA. Deaf and hearing parents with their hearing and deaf children are welcome to attend. This will be the first Mother, Father Deaf Day event in the Northwest. We would like to make it a traditional event annually in the NW. History fact: At the 1994 Children of Deaf Adults International Conference, the membership unanimously passed a resolution proclaiming the Mother, Father Deaf Day shall be established on the last Sunday in April. The first official observance was in 1996.

Independent Living Skills Program (ILS): Juniors and seniors in the ILS program, under the direction of Toni Stromberg, are working on an Apartment/Housing Search Project (March 12th- April12th). The sub-competency objectives they are addressing are:

1. Identifying advantages and disadvantages of different types of housing.
2. Listing personal housing requirements, including space, location and yard (housing considerations).
3. Identifying different types of housing available in the community.
4. Identifying y procedures for renting a house or apartment.

Flying Hands ASL Poetry Competition: March 8th WSD hosted the Flying Hands competition. It was a day-long event with 53 preschool through high school students at WSD participated, as well as elementary and middle school and high school students from Evergreen School District. The Oregon School for the Deaf wanted to attend but could not get approval for out-of-state travel. We hope they will join us next year.

MANY thanks to Piper Gallucci and Lisa Malone for organizing and running the event. Also thanks to the more than 20 volunteers who helped with a variety of important tasks. Finally, thanks to WSDAA, WSRID, Deaf Bilingual Coalition, WSASLTA, WSD-PSO for their donations of scholarship money for those students unable to pay the registration fee.

The event differed this year from previous years in that it was divided into a morning competition for elementary students and an afternoon performance for the secondary students. The genres were reduced to two: hand shape and fight song. This was based on feedback by the judges, who in previous years stated it was too difficult to judge one genre against another. It also follows the national standard of the Marie Jean Philip Competition.

- **Custodian Recruitment**

- **Negotiations**
