The Chair and Vice Chair were unable to attend today's meeting. Pursuant to WAC (Washington Administrative Code) 148-100-29(4) ("...the board of trustees shall elect for the meeting a chair pro tempore....") the Board nominated and elected a chair pro tempore for today's meeting

Char Parsley made a motion to nominate Pat Clothier as chair pro tempore for today's meeting. Larry Swift seconded the motion. It was voted on and approved.

The meeting was called to order by Pat Clothier, chair pro tempore, at 9:20 a.m. It was determined a quorum was present. Guests were introduced.

Congratulations to Allie Joiner on her re-appointment to a second term on the Board of Trustees.

Since Pat Clothier has served her second term and the Governor is reluctant to appoint individuals to boards for more than one term, Pat's appointment will not be renewed; however, Pat will continue on the board until a replacement is appointed.

Minutes – October 1, 2010

Larry Swift moved to approve the October 1, 2010, minutes. Ariele Belo seconded the motion. It was voted and approved with one abstention.

Reports - (complete written reports are included in the Board packet)

Rick Hauan, Director

- Core Team meeting
 - The last Core Team meeting was held on October 7th in Olympia. The Director expressed his appreciation for the time and commitment of each Core Team member.
- Construction update
 - Minor Public works projects
 - Sidewalks between the cottages – completed
 - New bathrooms and storage room in Clarke Hall – working on a few issues
 - Courtyard – going out to bid in January 2011
 - Auditorium project:
 - BLRB Architects (Tacoma) were chosen to lead the construction.
 - Students and staff have been meeting with the architects to share design ideas. This group will join the February 4th board meeting.
- RESPECT
 - The Director recently attended a RESPECT meeting. This meeting brings together professionals who provide services to children. Thanks to the K-20 system (video conferencing), representatives from around the state are able to attend.
- Special Education Director's meeting:
 - The Director attended meetings in Sequim (ESD 114) and Spokane (ESD 101) and asked each group the following question: "What services do you need and what services would you be willing to purchase"? Directors will discuss needs with business officers and superintendents in their districts to explore potential program support. They indicated they would like assessment, audiology, and SLP support.
- Auditorium seating – The Naval Air Station in Whidbey Island has auditorium seating available at no charge. Unfortunately, the cost to transport and refurbish the seats would not be cost effective.
- Tacoma Deaf Education meeting – CDHL's director has been invited to meet and assist Tacoma Public Schools with a 5-10 year plan for providing

education to deaf and hard of hearing children. What a great partnership opportunity.

Jane Mulholland, Superintendent (highlights)

- Admissions
 - A total of 33 students have been accepted or are in process of acceptance this school year. Many classes are at or approaching capacity.
- Clark County Community Pride Award
 - The Oliver Kastel building was chosen to receive the community pride award. Anna Kastel and her daughter Nancy Fitta were able to attend the ceremonies held on November 5th.

Outreach report

The Outreach Director is attending the ESD 112 Special Education Director's meeting this morning so the Director provided the following updates:

- The Starkey Foundation
 - Between WSD & OSD (Oregon School for the Deaf) the Starkey Foundation will have donated over \$3,000,000 worth of time and hearing equipment and time.
 - Thanks to the Starkey Foundation for this wonderful gift! A letter will be prepared for the Board's signature.
 - Also, thanks to all the staff involved in this event. Your dedication to our students is greatly appreciated.
- Family Academy Night
 - Last night's event was attended by 12 families. Very exciting evening!
- Silent Auction for Washington Family Activities
 - The Silent Auction held during Homecoming was a huge success! Over \$8,000 was raised. This money will be used for Deaf Family events.
 - Thanks to Kerianne Christie, Early Intervention Specialist, for setting up the auction. Great work Kerianne!
- Deaflympics
 - WSD's Audiologist, Jane Tabor, has been selected to serve as the new audiologist on the ICSD (International Committee of Sports for the Deaf) team for the Deaflympics! She will attend the winter games in February in Slovakia and the summer games in 2013 in Athens, Greece. Congratulations Jane!

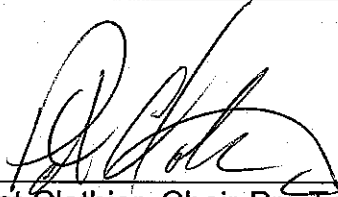

The Executive Session was cancelled.

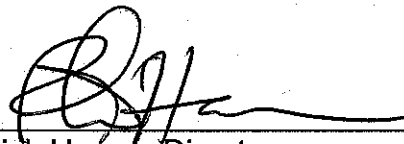
Adjournment
