Which of these people was the first woman elected President of the National Association of the Deaf (NAD).

**Answer: "b"** – Dr. Gertrude Scott Galloway was born third generation deaf in 1930. She grew up in Washington, D.C. and attended Kendall School on the campus of Gallaudet University. She was not only the first female president of the NAD she was also the first deaf woman superintendent of the Katzenback School for the Deaf in New Jersey, first woman president of the Conference of Educational Administrators of Schools for the Deaf (CEASD) and the first woman elected president of Deaf Seniors of America, Inc.
