Douglas Tilden is a world famous deaf sculptor. One example of his work, *The Bear Hunt*, is permanently displayed on the campus of Tilden's alma mater the California School for the Deaf at Fremont. Another famous work by Tilden graces the campus of a university. Which of the universities listed below display a masterful sculpture by Douglas Tilden?

- a) Gallaudet University
- b) University of California at Berkeley
- c) California State University at Northridge (CSUN)
- d) The National Technical Institute for the Deaf (NTID)

Bonus Question: What is the title of this sculpture?

Go to the bottom of this message for the answer.

Answer: "b" – University of California at Berkeley prominently displays one of Douglas Tilden's most famous sculptures entitled "*Football Players*." This work was actually created in Paris, France while Tilden was studying under another famous deaf sculptor, Paul Chopin. The statue was shipped to the United States

and found a permanent home on the campus of UC-Berkeley. [Cited from:
