- The ability to work as a team member




Purpose

The purpose of the PHSP is to serve young deaf adults, ages 18-22, who have a high school diploma or GED. Focus areas include job readiness, vocational training, independent living skills, and college support.

Employment Readiness Skills

- Filling out applications
- Writing resumes
- Conducting job searches
- Developing job interview skills
- Keeping a job
- Communicating with work peers and supervisor
- Being a team player



Vocational Training Areas

- Housekeeping (hotel, hospital, homes, schools)
- Food industry (prep cook, food service aide)
- Maintenance (school, hotel)
- Auto (tire & wheel, oil change industry)
- Individual interests
- Custom program based on interests
