The board meeting was called to order by Char Parsley, chair, at 9:45 a.m. It was determined a quorum was present. No modifications or adjustments were made to the agenda.

**Approval of meeting minutes**

Corrections:

- Page 1 – paragraph 1: Change “boardl” to “board”.

Nancy Fitta moved to approve the January 6, 2017, meeting minutes with the corrections noted above. Rita Reandeau. seconded the motion. It was voted on and approved.

## **Reports**

### **Board Finance Committee**

Due to monies received for statewide outreach services, CDHL was able to end January in the black.

### **Rick Hauan, Executive Director**

- Work on the national level is bringing Washington state to light. Met with Senators Maria Cantwell and Patty Murray during a recent visit to Washington, D.C. Also, met with the legislative director for representative Cathy McMorris-Rodgers and Governor Inslee's D.C. representative.
- Spokane Public Schools, in conjunction with their work with CDHL, has opened a DHH program at Franklin Elementary. They made a video highlighting this new program: <https://youtu.be/pbuR75Y0MxA>. The board was very impressed with the work that the executive director and statewide outreach team has done to support this program. There is a strong movement in Spokane to develop a community where DHH children are not alone anymore. The district has quarterly activities for families and the surrounding community.
- The next program development will be in the Bremerton area (ESD 114).
- Working with HSDC, Seattle Public Schools to see how we can better serve preschool children in that area. The executive director will be meeting with the Seattle Public Schools chief of support services and one of their school board members to discuss needed services.
- CDHL's executive director and the superintendent of WSSB were recently asked to speak before the House Education Committee about their respective programs. The PPT that CDHL's executive director shared with the committee was distributed to the board members. It was important to stress to the Committee that we invest in DHH students throughout the state which can impact educational programming throughout the country.

### **Sarah Decker, Outreach Coordinator**

By applying "Lean" principles to contract processes it has helped reduce the time spent on a contract. The state averages 45 days from when a contract is initiated until it is signed, CDHL averages 7 to 10 days. By getting the contracts out in a timely manner, monies are coming in a lot sooner.

Congratulations to Sarah Decker and Lorana Myers for their hard work in making the contract process much smoother.

### **Tom Galey, Director of Business Operations & Technology**

CDHL's budget is on target and aligned with forecasted goals.

### **Senior Trip 2017 (Seniors: Juan Gayton-Arroyo, Kyle Culmer, Brandy Pietsch; Senior Sponsor: Carly Leannah)**

The students presented the board with a letter outlining their request for an overnight senior trip to Long Beach, WA. Supervision would consist of three staff members; two

females and one male. The class has a budget of \$350 and the seniors would bring their own sleeping bags and tents. Seniors will be responsible for bringing their own spending money.


The Board congratulated the group on their preparation and planning.

Sidney Weldele-Wallace made a motion to tentatively approve the overnight senior trip with the understanding that the senior advisors and students would come back to the May 5<sup>th</sup> meeting to further outline supervision and funding details. Allie Joiner seconded the motion. It was voted on and approved. moved.

**WSDAA (Washington School for the Deaf Alumni Association) (Carey Price, Pam Randol, Linda Cole) (PPT)**

WSDAA was established in 1996 and currently has three museums in the Northrop elementary building. Membership is open to former students as well as current and retired staff. The group holds reunions every five years and the next one is scheduled for 2021.

WSDAA has done a tremendous job of supporting WSD students and staff over the years and the Board is very grateful for their commitment and dedication.



Larry Swift moved to adopt the resolution above for the dedication and support of WSDAA to the students and staff of the Washington School for the Deaf. Rita Reandeau seconded the motion. It was voted on and approved.

**Process for executive director's evaluation**

The Board will individually answer a series of survey questions regarding the executive director's work during the past two years. The responses will be recapped and discussed at the May 5<sup>th</sup> Board meeting.

Nancy Fitta moved to have the eight questions discussed in today's meeting turned into a survey and a link sent to Board members. Deadline for responding to the survey is April 15, 2017. Larry Swift seconded the motion. It was voted on and approved.

Since the executive director's evaluation is due by July 1<sup>st</sup> of odd numbered years, starting next year and every even numbered year thereafter, the Board will gather information from stakeholders and staff regarding the work of the executive director. With this information the Board will write their evaluation and submit it to the Governor's office.

Some of the ideas discussed were:

- Identify stakeholders
- Board members hold stakeholder meetings in their respective districts
- Develop a policy for the evaluation process
- Develop a "Health of the Agency" survey that can be distributed to various stakeholders
- Create tools regarding the agency function and leadership and design questions that link directly to the work of the executive director
- For the executive director:
  - Summarize what is running well.
  - What are the challenges that remain?
  - What is your vision for overcoming those challenges?
  - How are you growing leadership?
  - Three to five-year outlook.

Larry moved that henceforth the Board's evaluation of the executive director will include information from stakeholders. However, for this cycle and since time is short the Board will respond a survey of eight questions and the responses will be discussed at the next meeting. Nancy Sinkovitz seconded the motion. It was voted on and approved.

**General enrollment notes:** After a small dip, enrollment is creeping back up this spring. We are currently at 96 students in the pre-k through 12 program, and WaCAD has 10, bringing WSD to a grand total of 106 students. This is consistent with historical data, however what is notable is that enrollment continues to grow at the elementary level, while secondary is showing small declines. See enrollment report included in this Board packet.

**Events:** We are so proud of our Deaf Teen America students! Annie Kvamme and John Smart along with Stowe Beecher traveled to Ohio for this national competition. Annie and John are the national Deaf Teens for 2017-2018. They each earned scholarships to Gallaudet, and stipends for camps at RIT this summer should they choose to go. They had to perform a talent (poem), answer questions and participate in a variety of other events. They beat out students from other deaf schools around the country.

JA Biztown was recently held in Auburn, Washington (April 26<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup>). This was a two day event that had over a 100 participants, including our middle and high school students. It was a great event that focused on getting ready for life after school. I watched students participate in mock interviews, and was hugely impressed with how they answered questions in professional manners. Our work education program has prepared our students so well!

12 students and 2 staff members went to Austin, Texas for the annual Berg Seeger Track Classic in early April. This is an annual track meet where deaf schools from around the country compete in track and field events. Our students did great! A lot of personal records were attained and they had a great experience. This event was partly made possible due to a generous donation from the DEAF foundation. DEAF continues to support WSD in a myriad of ways, and we are grateful for this. Make sure to check out the wine tasting event in early September!

May 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup>, we will be opening our doors for a WSD Patron Open House. This is the second annual event like this, however we are expanding it to include several deaf people from the community. We have invited students from around the state to come with their parents, stay the night and attend classes with our students. If you know of any student that may be interested in WSD, please send them our way! Interested parties can contact me for more information.

All Star Day for elementary students is May 31<sup>st</sup> and for secondary students June 1<sup>st</sup>. We will have a book fair and a senior sponsored carnival. Come and join the fun!

**Recruitment:** Rick Whitney and Jason Cox have been appointed as permanent Director of Residential Services and Secondary Principal respectively. We are thrilled to have them on board. A secondary SLP and a secondary counselor (Amy Blades) have also been hired for school year 2017-2018.

**Accolades:** SLCs Candace Davis and Jayne King are Special Olympics coaches for our WSD students. They deserve special shout outs for the ongoing dedication and support for these students. I love hearing their stories and it always warms my heart to see how hard these kids work.






