Events

Optimist Club Competition: On May 5th, we sent two students to participate in the Optimist Club Competition in British Columbia: Annie Kvamme and Kyle Culmer. Tyler DeShaw was unable to go due to an injury, so Michelle Clark and Teresa Stotler-Martin volunteered to drive the students up for the weekend. Both students represented WSD well and had a great time. We are fortunate to have staff that support our students in all of their endeavors!

All Star Day: Elementary and Secondary departments pulled off another successful annual event. Elementary held their rewards on May 31st, and secondary on June 1st. Both days were filled with special parent visits and celebrations and yummy food! It was especially inspiring to see all of the students rewarded in some way for their hard work in both academics and sports. The secondary department had a focus on transition with 8 deaf professionals from the community coming to share their stories on how they came to be in the profession that they are in. It was a highly successful event.

Sports Highlights: For the second year in a row, WSD sent athletes to Cheney, Washington for the 1B/2B/1A State Track and Field Championships at Eastern Washington University over Memorial Day weekend. We sent 8 athletes, the biggest WSD contingent in recent history. The WSD track program continues to expand, and this year for the first time in recent WSD history, we had a middle school and elementary track program! Middle school and elementary teams also sent qualifying students to local regional meets. Impressive! Kudos to Ron Spratlen, high school track coaches Tyler DeShaw, Matthew Schindel, and elementary/middle school track coach Nathan Boyes for putting together such a stellar track program at WSD. We also sent our WSD Special Olympics Soccer Team to the state tournament Pacific Lutheran University the weekend of June 2-4, 2017. Our students rocked it! Each of the three games they played went into overtime, and the players walked away with a second place medal for their division. We are super proud of our students. Coaches Candace Davis, Ron Spratlen and Chris Newell are to be commended for the time and effort they have put in supporting our students and allowing for them to shine.

Deaf Field Day: Nathan Boyes led a special event that drew students from OSD, local DHH students from Evergreen school district and students from the Portland, Oregon area on June 5th. Students in grades 5-8 participated in 5 different field events and ate lunch in our cafeteria. It was a fun day that included events such as a mile run, a

medicine ball throw, softball toss and other events. It was a huge project to coordinate and ran very smoothly. Staff and students had a good time.

DLR visit: June 5th was also the day that Division of Licensing and Review came to do a triennial evaluation that includes a comprehensive review of our residential and safety systems. We do not have results back yet, but initial reports are positive. One reviewer said the fact that she was looking for things to improve that included cutting bushes lower to the ground for clear visibility meant that we have a very safe campus!


