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SUBJECT: **WSD After School Program**

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On a space availability basis, children who are not enrolled at the Washington School for the Deaf (WSD) may participate in the after school program at the WSD. To the extent non-enrolled children reflect a wide cross-section of the local community; these recreational opportunities will promote incidental learning in the least restrictive environment, in accordance with the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act.

In order for a non-enrolled child to participate in the recreation program at the WSD, the parent(s), guardian(s), or adult student must read and sign the following documents:

- Non-Enrolled Student Participation Form
- Non-Enrolled Student Disclosure Statement
- Non-Enrolled Student Release of Liability, Assumption of Risk, and Informed Consent
- Non-Enrolled Student Expectations and Agreements
- Non-Enrolled Student Medical Information
- Non-Enrolled Student Medical Care

The disclosure statement is intended to identify children who may pose a risk to the health, safety, or welfare of other children and must be submitted prior to participation.

Participation is on a "space available basis" and only available to children who have sign-communication skills and are not enrolled at the WSD. Participation is not available to children who require additional supervision from WSD staff (unless that supervision is provided by the child's parent or guardian and approved by WSD) or who may pose a risk to the health, safety, or welfare of WSD staff and students.

Initial participation for any non-enrolled child does not create a continuing right to participation. Participation in the recreation program may be terminated at any time at the discretion of the WSD.
