Course Description: In Independent Art class, you will be given the opportunity to learn new art skills and work on projects that interest you. We will be focusing on art skills as well as planning, time management, working with materials and problem solving. It will be your responsibility to decide on a project, figure out what materials are needed, and the steps you'll need to take in order to complete the project. I will be providing you with guidance and assistance, but you will be expected to manage your time and complete projects within a reasonable time frame. My role as your teacher in this class is to provide you with guidance, support and feedback as you work independently on your projects.

After you finish a project, you will need to take a picture of it with your iPad and email it to me for grading. This will help me keep track of your work and this will also help you develop a digital portfolio of all your work throughout the year. When you take a picture with your iPad, make sure the photo is clear and well-lit! Your work will *not* be graded if I don't get an email from you, so be sure you remember to email me!

At the end of each quarter, you will create a presentation showcasing all of the work you have completed so far. You will be describing the process you went through to create your artwork, as well as the new skills and concepts you learned in class.

- Remain on task throughout class
- Follow directions given by the teacher
- Do your best work at all times
- Clean up before leaving the classroom
- Turn in assignments on time (if you work hard and still need more time, let me know)
