From the Superintendent's Desk

Greetings to our Terrier Families in 2022!!

2022 is starting with a bang! Our design-build team, Skanska-Mithun, is eager and ready to begin stakeholder meetings for the new K-12 Academic Building and Gym! We have scheduled the first round of stakeholder workshops for the week of **January 10-14th**. This will include a town hall, classroom visits, learning sessions, campus experience mapping with students and staff focus groups. Their purpose is to get to know us, see how we function on campus and understand our vision for the future facilities. They will be on our campus several times over the spring and more information will be shared as we have it.

This is just the beginning of a very long process. I know many are curious about the timeline for the new building and gym. Recall that we do NOT have a design yet—this is why the team is coming to campus frequently. They are beginning the design work now. That will take approximately 18 months. **Currently, we are estimating to break ground for the new building May of 2023 and to move in to the new building by summer of 2024.**

As we head in to the wintry weather months, I want to take this opportunity to remind families of our school's operating procedures. Because we are a residential school with approximately 50% of our student population residing on campus Sunday through Friday, if inclement weather hits while residential students are on campus, school may close, but residential students would stay in the cottages. What this means for locally residing families: watch the news or other social media outlets for updates for your home school district. Our transportation for local students is provided through ESD 112. They will follow whatever the local school districts do.

For example, if you live in the Battleground School District, and it closes due to inclement weather, there will be no transportation provided that day, even if WSD is open. WSD typically follows Vancouver School District's inclement weather operations.

Please call us if you have questions. We will post any school updates related to inclement weather on our [WSD website](#). We will also try to post on the [WSD Facebook page](#) any updates about school closures.

Your child's safety is always our highest priority. The school will notify you if travel to and/or from the school is deemed unsafe. There may be times that we cannot transport students either to or from school due to inclement weather. If this is the case, we will alert you and work on alternate means (either time or date) for safely transporting students.

Speaking of safety, **COVID** continues to march alongside us into the new year. Guidelines for school operations remain the same. Students are expected to wear masks at all times except when eating, sit in class at least three feet away from each other and 6 feet when eating. Our testing capabilities continue to expand. We will be reaching out to families with more information soon.

School continues to be busy. Please see all of the fun, exciting things happening throughout this newsletter. I hope you are off to a wonderful start in 2022!

Dear Parents/Guardians,

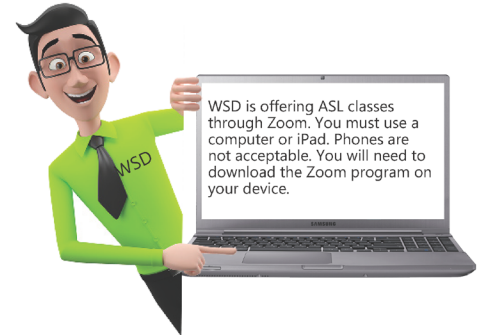
