Dear Terrier Families and Friends,

We are well on our way to wrapping up an historical year! Staff and students are enjoying the short time we have together on campus, but soon we will be saying goodbye again. I am hopeful that it will only be for the usual 10-week summer vacation this time. The Office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction (OSPI) for Washington has announced that they expect all public schools to offer full in-person services for those families that want it with continued mitigation practices in place (face coverings, social distancing, additional ventilation and cleaning practices). The mitigation efforts may change over the summer, and we will communicate those when we know of them. Please keep an eye out for email communications from the school over the summer. At this time, there are no COVID vaccine requirements for students to attend school. Children ages 12 and up are eligible to receive vaccines.

When students and staff return at the end of August, they will see some BIG changes on campus. We will begin work to demolish four buildings down the center of campus. This is in preparation for a new Academic Building and Gym to be built in 2022! This project will be a huge task and will take at least two years to complete, but may take as long as 3 to 4. We expect to be obtain occupancy in 2025. This is very exciting! While we are making improvements to our educational programs, we are also preserving a bit of history. Recently, our elementary building, Northrop, was added to the National Historic Register. There was a nice article in the Columbian about it.
